Communication and Language

In C+L, we will be encouraging the children to talk in full sentences by scaffolding and modelling.

We will be introducing new ambitious vocabulary linked to topic of 'Little Red', animals and the season of spring.

What you can do to help at home:

- Encourage your child to talk about things they like.
 Support your child to reply in sentences.

Physical Development
In physical development, we are focusing on building strength, coordination, and movement skills. With the support of our sports coach, children will develop their climbing, throwing, movement, and balancing skills through gymnastics. Additionally, we will take part in Kinetic Letters and Squiggle While You Wiggle daily—both designed to strengthen core muscles and fine motor skills, helping to prepare children for writing.

What you can do to help at home:

- Go for walks, have a dance, or try different ways of moving and balancing together.



This term, we will be focusing on the book 'Little Red', exploring storytelling and early writing skills. We will also be developing early writing skills by: Planning and saying a sentence accurately, Representing parts of a sentence with drawings or meaningful marks Later in the term, we will move on to writing to inform, where children will create their own instructions on How to Trap a Wolf-inspired by the

This will help develop their understanding of sequencing, sentence structure, and purposeful writing in a fun and engaging way.

Maths

This term, we will be deepening our understanding of numbers 9 and 10, including: recognising and sorting numbers 9 and 10, exploring the composition of 10 and subitising within 10, understanding 1 more and 1 less within 10, learning doubles to 10. We will also be identifying odd and even numbers and recognising and finding 3D shapes in our environment.

What you can do to help at home: Get involved in the weekly home learning activities.

Understanding the World

This term, we will be learning all about animals, their environments, and the world around us. Our key areas of focus include: Animal Families, Animal Environments, Exploring Animal Features, Similarities and Differences in Animals, Exploring the World with a Globe and Map. Through these activities, children will develop a greater understanding of the natural world and the incredible diversity of animals that share our planet. We will also be looking a special things; looking at arteracts, images and stories, children will explore the meaning and value of items to some people.

Expressive Arts and Design

This term, we will be getting creative with clay, playdough, and sculpture, helping children develop their artistic expression and fine motor skills. Our key areas of focus include: exploring clay and playdough-investigating their properties, shaping materials, and using tools safely with confidence. Children will also work with natural 3D landscape pictures using found objects. They will be creating and painting sculptures-bringing designs to life by sculpting with clay and painting the finished pieces.
